Report From the President...

Senator Stewart Greenleaf and Representative Mary Ann Dailey held a press conference on May 1, 2001 to introduce "The Water Well Construction Legislation".

The main components of the draft proposal are as follows:

- Requires minimum statewide standards for location, inspection, construction, alteration, temporary closure and decommissioning of water wells.
- Establishes criteria for licensure and certification of water-well contractors and drillers.
- Establishes a State Board of Certification of Water-Well Enforcement Officers, Water-Well Drillers and Water-Well Contractors.
- Provides for registration of water-wells and submission of water quality and well yield reports.
- Grandfathers existing local agency water-well construction ordinances.
- Establishes the Water-Well Conservation Fund, whereby landowners may apply for a grant to permanently close (decommission) any water-well.
- No regulation may be promulgated to require the decommissioning of any water well in which initial construction activity was commenced prior to the effective date of the regulations promulgated under this act.
- States that the construction, temporary closure and decommissioning standards will apply to new water-wells installed after the regulations are published. Any water-well drilled prior to the adoption of the regulations which is altered, temporarily closed or decommissioned after adoption of the regulation must be done in accordance with state approved procedures.
- Establishes a reimbursement mechanism for local agencies responsible for inspection and enforcement of water well construction.
- Establishes a permanent technical advisory committee to the DEP to assist in the development of rules and regulations.


To date, this legislation has the support of the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the Pennsylvania Groundwater Association, the Pennsylvania Council of Professional Geologists, Pennsylvania Association of Sewage Enforcement Officers, and the Chester County Health Department, government associations, environmental and watershed organizations, as well as the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau, the Montgomery County Health Department, the PA State Association of Boroughs, 10,000 Friends, the Montgomery County Lands Trust, and 46 members of the House of Representatives.

This legislation is to protect our precious ground water. It is not intended to hinder or put any drilling company out of business. It will insure that all wells are drilled properly.

We will be licensed like other professionals. The PGWA will have the majority on the Certification Board and the Advisory Board for standards. We will also train the water-well enforcement officers.

On June 16, 2001, the PGWA Summer Meeting will be held at Campbell Manufacturing Company, Railroad Street, Bechtelsville, PA (610-367-2107). Please plan to attend. It will be very informative.

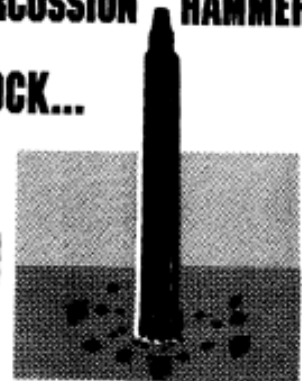

Proposal Would Set Standards for Wells

Purpose is to protect state's groundwater, users, legislators say

Two suburban Philadelphia lawmakers are introducing legislation to require minimum statewide construction standards for wells and certification of the people who drill them.

"At stake are the health of citizens who depend upon water from private wells and the protection of our groundwater resources from contamination by improperly constructed private wells," Senator Stewart Greenleaf, R-Montgomery County said at a Capitol press conference yesterday.

While Pennsylvania is second among states in number of households served by private wells -- more than 1 million with 21,000 new wells drilled annually -- it is among just four states without construction standards or certification requirements, Greenleaf said.

A federal study five years ago found bacterial contamination in 70 percent of wells surveyed in south-central Pennsylvania and brine contamination of an underground aquifer in northern counties from private well drillers going too deep, according to Greenleaf.

Rep. Mary Ann Dailey, R-Montgomery County, said state law requires an individual driller or contracting company to obtain a license or registration from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources by paying a fee.

They don't have to take a competency examination.

The new legislation, which Dailey said she helped draft after hearing from constituents who had experienced bacterial contamination of their wells, would:

- Set minimum statewide standards for location, inspection, construction and closure of wells.
- Establish criteria and a state board for licensing well contractors and certifying well drillers.
- Create a grant program, funded with well fees and fines, to help property owners pay for sealing old wells no longer in use.
- Provide for registration of wells and submission of water quality and well yield results.

Dailey estimated that the legislation

will add about \$600 to \$1,000 to the cost of drilling a well.

"In the long run it would give the homeowner, the person using that well, peace of mind and maybe a lot less testing requirements," Greenleaf said.

Richard Raab, president of the Pennsylvania Ground Water Association, which represents well drillers, said his association supports the legislation because many of its members are already drilling to these standards.

"We have been pushing for this for years. If we don't have clean groundwater we won't have any wells to drill," Raab said.

Greenleaf and Dailey, both Republicans, said the legislation also drew the support of the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau, Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, Pennsylvania Council of Professional Geologists, Susquehanna River Basin Commission, and Pennsylvania Association of Sewage Enforcement Officers.

Dear Senator _____:

On behalf of the Pennsylvania Ground Water Association (PGWA), representing nearly 300 of Pennsylvania's leading well driller and pump installers, we are asking for your endorsement and support of legislation to protect our most precious resource, groundwater. This legislation has been recently introduced into both Houses of the Pennsylvania Legislature.

The purpose of this legislation is to protect groundwater resources by establishing location and construction standards for water-wells and requiring companies and individuals drilling water-wells to be properly licensed and certified. According to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) officials, it is estimated that there are over one million private water wells in the Commonwealth and that 20,000 new water wells are being drilled annually. Recognizing that many Pennsylvanians come to rely on their drinking water from wells, it is vital that they be constructed properly by certified drillers to minimize any contamination of

groundwater, thus protecting the public's health and our natural resource.

As it stands now, only a few countries and local governments have adapted varying degrees of requirements for water well construction. Improper construction or location of water-wells may lead to contamination of groundwater and possibly affect the entire aquifer of the community. That is why the PGWA strongly supports legislation which establishes a statewide standard for water-well construction and certification of well drillers. According to the National Ground Water Association, 45 states have enacted similar laws.

Under our proposal, the Department of Environmental Protection would administer the overall provisions of the act while the Environmental Quality Board would be responsible for adapting standards for the location, construction, alteration and closure of water-wells, criteria information on groundwater quality and quantity.
